Instruments for Sale: Peggy Turner has several instruments for sale. Hammered Dulcimer: large hammered dulcimer made by Dana Hamilton. It has some broken strings and comes with a set of hammers. There is no stand. Hurdy-Gurdy: this is a medieval style Hurdy-Gurdy made by the Kelischek Workshop, an older Minnesinger model. It has one melody and 2 drone strings and

has a diatonic keyboard with programmable tangents. \$250. Irish Flute: wooden 6-hole, no-key, Irish syle blackwood flute, made in Ireland. It has two head joints. The all wood head joint has a crack that has been repaired once and needs to be repaired again. The other head joint is metal and works fine. It does not have a case. \$200. Tenor Recorder: this is a Rottenburgh model grenadilla wood recorder made by Moeck. It was purchased new in the 1980s. It has a clear bright tone and plays well across the range.
